FROM THE RACE CHAIR

After a delicious BYC breakfast complements of Rey and Mary Neville, we held a race fleet meeting and practice starts on Saturday, April 17th.

During the meeting, there were discussions on the handicaps, the sailing instructions and some new courses for this season:

We decided to document the process we use to set handicaps – determining base PHRF, adjustments to PHRF, non-spinnaker adjustment and time-on-time correction factors. This document should be completed in a couple of weeks. It should help everyone understand how his or her boat's handicap was developed.

We will also add more detail to the race schedule to show the planned type of course - Olympic Modified, Long Course or Windward/Leeward - for each race in advance. This should help avoid last minute decisions and conflicts on the day of the race.

The updated BYC sailing instructions will be posted to the web site shortly.

We had perfect conditions on the lake for the practice starts. There was a warm South breeze and clear skies. BYC has finally changed to the standard 5-minute start sequence this season. Gypsy, Rascal and Lady Rosetta participated. All of the boats improved their starts during the practice session. We also got to shakedown the committee boat equipment.

The spring series races will be held on:

Spring Race #1: Sunday, April 25th Spring Race #2: Saturday, May 15th Spring Races #3 & #4: Saturday, May 22nd Spring Race #5: Sunday, June 13th

So mark your calendar and plan to join us. As this issue of Boulder Bits goes out, you still have time to sign a declaration (download from the BYC website) and start racing. If you plan to race and you haven't sent in your race declaration, please send it in as soon as possible so that we can complete the handicap calculations.

If you have reservations about racing because you feel that you have a lack of knowledge, I would be glad to go over the racing rules and our sailing instructions with you individually. We can probably even find a volunteer if you would like someone with experience to go out with you for one of the races.

I look forward to seeing all of you on the lake!


