FROM THE RACE CHAIR

The BYC Commodore's Cup Regatta was held on Saturday, October 9th. It was a single start, non-spinnaker race with high and low PHRF fleets. Twenty-Eight boats from all four of Carlyle Lake's sailing clubs started the race. It was a 30 degree Olympic modified port rounding course with 1 mile legs. The winds were at 30 degrees at about 7 knots at the beginning of the race. About a half hour into the race the winds dropped to less that 3 knots and backed 60 degrees to the NW. *Mischief* led the race until the leeward leg when she was passed by *Bullet* who eventually took the horn. *Mean Machine* had great boat speed and kept close to the leaders. The winner of the Low PHRF fleet was *Mean Machine*. *Bullet* took second place followed by *Mischief* in third. The San Juan boats dominated the High PHRF group. First, second and third went to *Witch Juan, Knotta Yachta* and *Spitfire*, respectively.

San Juan 21's took 6 of the top 10 spots. CSA boats took 5 of the 6 trophies for the Commodore's cup, with the 6th going to a CYC boat. The highest finishers from BYC were *Casa Cita II* in Low PHRF and *Ozzacle* in High PHRF.

Many thanks to Dave and Lynn Murdoch and Ken Schowe for their work on the Commordore's Cup committee boat and to Bob Bender for placing the wing mark and the pin. Also, a special thanks to Parks Smith and Barb Weber for their help with management of the race.

The first BYC Fall Series was held on Sunday, September 26th. This was actually the 3rd scheduled race. Races 1 & 2 were moved to make-up days due to a lack of wind. Six boats started the race in about 10 knots of wind from the NE. The course was a 5 mile 30 degree port rounding Olympic modified. On corrected time, *Desperado* took first, *Ob-La-Di* second and *Déjà Vu* third. Much thanks goes to Bill Haussman for having his boat towed out to the lake to be committee boat for this race while his engine was off of the boat for repairs.

Race 4 of the Fall series was sailed on Sunday, October 3rd. The wind was out of the NE at 5-10 knots. The course was a 5 mile 30 degree port rounding Olympic modified. *Déjà Vu* led the way for the first 4 ½ miles of the race and was passed by *Desperado* on the last windward leg. The order of finish was *Desperado* first, *Déjà Vu* second and *Casa Cita II* third.

Race 5 of the Fall series was started in winds over 20 kts. and 5 ft. waves on Saturday, October 16th. It was a 5 mile port rounding Olympic modified 270 degree course. Five boats signed up for the race. Only 2 boats started and one finished. The winner was *Serenity*.

The make-ups for Fall series races 1 and 2 were held on Saturday, October 22nd. The wind was out of the Southeast at 10-12 knots with 3 ft. waves. Both races took place on a 210 Starboard Olympic course. This last day of BYC racing for the season was probably the best this year with steady wind, cool temperatures and clear skies. *Rascal* finished first in both races. *Déjà Vu* was second in the first race and *Serenity* took second place in the third race.

The detailed results of the BYC Fall Series are posted on the BYC Website. The final standings for the series are:

- 1st Place *Desperado*
- 2nd Place *Serenity*
- 3rd Place Déjà Vu

Congratulations to Dennis Smith and crew on their Fall Series championship.

As was discussed at our annual general meeting, we are planning to establish a BYC handicap committee this winter to document our handicap rules and set handicaps going forward. This should promote better understanding of the handicaps, give some relief to the incoming race chairman and provide continuity in the handicaps from year to year. Please contact me if you are interested in providing input to this committee.

Overall, BYC had a successful racing year. We averaged about

5 boats per regular series race, 10 boats participated in the Renshaw Regatta and there was a large lake-wide turnout for the Commodore's Cup. I would like to thank all of the race fleet members who served committee boat duty, hauled out marks or otherwise supported this year's racing program.

MINUTES of BOARD of DIRECTORS And GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING October 10, 2004

The meeting convened 0900.

Allan Stewart, Board Chairman called the meeting to order and provided opening remarks. In addition to Allan, the following Board members were present at the meeting: John Carnasiotis, Dave Unttendorfer, Ken Schowe, Rey Neville (Non Voting).

The Annual Officer and Board Member election was the first order of business. Since the Official Ballot was uncontested, the following 2005 officers and directors were elected by a show of hands at the meeting:

Rey Neville, BYC Commodore for this year, thanked everyone for a very successful and fun year at Boulder Yacht Club. Special thanks were provided the following people:

- All the party hosts, race committees and volunteers who gave of their time and talents to make our social and racing activities a success this year.

Dennis Smith, gave a presentation on lighting the entrance to the marina to make night sailing safer and more convenient. He has obtained several heavy-duty solar lights from the Corps of Engineers. Dennis displayed the lights and discussed some options for installing them. He discussed the possibility of having BYC membership assistance in installing the lights and assisting in checking and keep the lights in working order. Following a discussion of placement alternatives, it was concluded that Dennis would explore installing the lights on buoys rather than placing them on or near the shore. This alternative negated the need for club assistance.

The No Boat planning is in work and it will be held February, 26th at Le Chateau, a catering facility on Clayton Road near Lindberg in St. Louis County, Mo. The Hilton St. Louis Frontenac Hotel is nearby for those who desire no worries about designated driver duty. The hotel usually honors special rates for ten or more blocks of rooms.

The tent will come down after the final Halloween weekend party. The Schmidt family has volunteered to take care of it. Thank you to the Schmidt family for the many volunteer actions at BYC.

Next years Racing plans were discussed by Rich Carson with some recommended changes in the way we do PHRF. The goal would be to baseline our approach to match other clubs and follow more closely national standard racing rules.

Rey Neville discussed the benefits of joining the new discussion list, YahooGroups (http://groups. yahoo.com/group/boulderyc/). If you have trouble please call Rey and he will be happy to help. The previous discussion list, Topica, will be shut down at the end of this year.

The meeting adjourned about 0930.
