FROM THE RACE CHAIR

The final make-up race of the BYC Spring Series was held on Sunday, August 8th. Going into this race there was a 3-way tie for first place in the series. It turned out to be a real endurance test with very light winds and warm temperatures. After a one-hour delay waiting for the wind to fill in, the race was started with light winds out of the West. Desperado, October Breeze and Rascal took a commanding lead early in the race but dropped out hours after the wind changed to light and variable. These boats actually sailed a longer distance than the boats that would eventually finish the race. About 4 hours into the race, the course was shortened to 3 miles. Déjà Vu and Water Music finished first and second, respectively.

Congratulations to our commodore Rey Neville and crew on their Spring Series championship. I would also like to thank Rey for his consistent support of BYC's racing program. Water Music was one of only 2 boats that participated in all 5 of the Spring Series races.

The Renshaw Regatta was held on Saturday, August 21st. Two races were scheduled but the wind only allowed for one race to be completed. It was a 30 degree windward/leeward port rounding course. The conditions were light and variable winds with no waves on the lake. Nine BYC boats started this race. After about an hour, the race was shortened to a 2 mile length. The winner was Desperado. Ob-La-Di took second place followed by Ragtime in third. Congratulations to Dennis Smith on a close win. It's great to see BYC members new to our race program like Garen Miller and Tim Smith and crew doing so well. It was very encouraging to see nine boats come out for this regatta. I hope some of this momentum can be carried into our Fall Series.

September is a big month for racing on Carlyle Lake. There is racing every weekend. The winds are normally very good in September. We plan to hold our first 3 races of the Fall Series on Saturday, September 4th, Saturday, September 11th and Sunday, September 26th. The Whale of a Sail is scheduled for September 18th & 19th.

We have rescheduled the **Midnight Fun Race** that was abandoned due to thunderstorms on the night of the race. It will now be held on **Saturday, September 25th**. The skippers' meeting will be held at 5 PM and the race should start at approximately 6:30 PM. We hope to see you there.

NOTICE OF RACE

Rules. The race will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (2001-2004). the proscriptions of US Sailing, except as any of those that are altered by the Sailing Instructions, and by this Notice of Race.

Eligibility. The BYC Commodore's Cup non-spinnaker race is open to all monohull cabin boats regularly sailed on Carlyle Lake and all owners of monohull cabin sailboats who belong to BYC, CSA or CYC. A completed registration form and a signed BYC Racing Declaration are required to enter the race. BYC racing fleet members who have already submitted a 2004 BYC racing declaration only need to complete the registration and fees section on the next page to enter.

Course. The course will be a modified olympic triangle with up to 3 mile legs, depending on wind and lake conditions. The racing area will be in the central part of the lake.

Sailing instructions. Instructions will be available on the day of the race at the skipper's meetings.

Handicaps. Time-on-time handicaps will be used. They will be based on PHRF handicaps adjusted to non-spinnaker ratings and other performance factors such as maximum head sail size, prop configuration, etc.

Measurements. All boats planning to race will provide the P, E, I and J, measurements on the BYC Racing Declaration.

Alternative Penalties. The 720 degree turn penalty rule 44.1 and 44.2 of the racing rules will apply.

Prizes: Prizes will be awarded to the boats placing first, second, and third in each division as well as to the overall winner.

Marina Accommodations and access. For boats wanting to stay overnight, slips are available by calling Boulder Marina at 618-226-3223. To enter the marina stay within one boat length of the north rip-rap wall that leads to the cove.
