Our illustrious Secretary, Deanna Schroeder, had a great idea to list recipes in the Boulder Bits for dishes that we cook and eat at the lake. She's been kind enough to start us out with our first recipe, Sweet Corn Casserole.

#### Sweet Corn Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 (15 ¼-ounce) Can Whole Kernel Corn, drained
- 1 (14 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-ounce) Can Cream-Style Corn
- 1 (8-ounce) Package Jiffy Corn Muffin Mix
- 1 Cup Sour Cream
- 1/2 Cup (1 stick) Butter, melted
- 1 to 1 ½ Cups Shredded Cheddar

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. In a large bowl, stir together the 2 cans of corn, corn muffin mix, sour cream, and melted butter.
- 3. Pour into a greased casserole dish.
- 4. Bake for 45 minutes, or until golden brown.
- 5. Remove from oven and top with cheddar.
- 6. Return to oven for 5 to 10 minutes, or until cheese is melted.
- 7. Let stand for at least 5 minutes and then serve warm.


