WINTERIZE YOUR BOATS

Here are some ideas about winter storing your boats from Steve Kratchman.

For those leaving their boats in the marina, there will be days neither Craig nor Dennis will be there. It would behoove you to get the boat owner's name and phone number of those on your dock. When out to your boat, you and/or the other boat owners might look over to see that all is right with those boats on their docks. An alert by cell phone, which most have, could save a neighbor's boat...or your own.

Upon putting up for the winter, wax or poliglow or whatever, but treat you hull with protection against the UV rays of the sun and the elements. Next spring, cleaning up and preparing with another finish will be easier and quicker.

Any sponge or stuffing rag in any opening under and on top of the boat will insure nesting and crawling insects and other critters will not be there to greet you upon returning next spring.

If you leave your cushions on board during the winter, do stand them up in any way you can to keep moisture from condensation from creating a mildew condition. A cold night and a sunny day on a boat are conditions creating this.

Leaving a boat uncovered is asking for premature aging of the topsides along with opening up several spots for leaks, not all apparent inside the cabin. Some just go into the bilge. And mildew can create unlivable conditions inside a closed boat. If possible; allowing air to flow through such as cracking open the forward hatch and a rear port opening will help.

If you have batteries fully charged and can come out to recharge them periodically, leaving them on the boat is no problem. If you take them home to store, place on raised wood, never on concrete. That will kill them! A battery, showing less than 10.4 amps is essentially dead and will never hold a charge as when new.


