What can we do to our boats over the winter to make them trouble free next summer. One problem is that our engines overheat. Some engine manufactures recommend changing the water pump every year. Well, so much for that idea most of us wait till it overheats out on the lake and either fix it there or get towed back to the dock and then try to figure why it overheated. Some manufactures suggest taking the water pump out and putting it in a plastic bag for the winter, but don't recommend it because we forget to reinstall it and the engine overheats anyway. One way to make the pumps last longer is to coat them with lithium or silicon grease, not Vaseline as it attacks the rubber pump. Next month if you like we will suggest some other winter project. Tell us what you want to know.
