

Ahoy Racers, news from the Race Chair,

Wow it's November already, and with only a month to go in the season, the racing on the lake has come to an end. On October 4th we had our big lake wide event that had an excellent turnout, attracting 19 boats registering and 18 completing the race. We had 7 entries from "BYC", unfortunately all the trophies went to the other clubs (again). I hope to see more BYC boats racing in the future and hopefully we can keep some of the awards here.

Our last two series races were held on Oct. 11th, with light air and a shortened course we managed to get both races in with 4 boats competing. The final standings for the series races are as follows: in the ODR Fleet – Thor take first place with Valdez nipping at his heels taking second place, in the JAM Fleet we had a mix of racers with Casa Cita II as the only boat to complete four races, taking first, Sailing Fox completing three races to take second, while the rest of the fleet only managing the complete one or two races, October Breeze and Gail Force managing to get in two races, and Quicksilver and Albatross completing one race. I would like to thank Jeff Morrison/Gail Force for participating in the last two races on Oct. 11th, so that we had two boats competing in each fleet, and Thorsten for all his help this season. Thanks guys. October also held the last two lake wide races, the CYC Moonlight held on the 18th, with 5 BYC boats competing and Barry Nelson taking first place in the JAM division, and on the 25th the CYC Great Race, which also had 5 BYC boats racing, with Barry again placing, this time he took fourth place in the spinnaker division.
