Product Review- LED DUAL CABIN LIGHT by Deb

This month's featured product comes highly recommended by someone who spends a lot of time in the galley - me! We had a very inadequate incandescent light that was unfortunately mounted directly over the spice rack on the bulkhead over the sink, blocking all of its light and leaving the dishwasher (me) groping to find the dishes and never knowing if they were clean. We recently purchased a dual LED adjustable light which my wonderfully thoughtful captain mounted over the stove, allowing one of the arms to be aimed over

the sink and one over the stove. Voila! These two lights use less electricity than the previous one light and allowed me to see better while cooking and dishwashing in the galley. We liked it so well that we installed on the V-berth bulkhead so we can read by it.


