----FROM THE RACE CHAIR ----

September was a month of traveling and working the trade show for me, with just a sprinkle of racing thrown in. The CSA Whale was unfortunately on one of these work weekends, as was the Strawberry Ladies Race, maybe next year.

Our very own big lake wide event just happened last weekend. The first Commodore Cup was back in 1978, which makes this lake wide event one of the oldest ones on the lake. 33 years in the running it's held on the first weekend in October since a very long time.

Many Thanks for all the ladies who cooked up a great chili and thanks to the marina to put some needed plastic around the party area. Thanks to GailForce for lending us their boat and helped to do CB duty.

First the couple of small problems we had. It was blowing a stiff 30 knots northerly and we had monster waves the more south you go on the lake, consequently two of our marks couldn't hold and were drifting south past the CB It didn't make a whole lot of difference as the course length stayed about the same. The second blunder was that my Photo battery wasn't charged. The third happened at the result calculation which did not put Bill Bertrand on Just SO in front of Bullet in the first race. Bullet still won the class as Bill had to bow out the second race.

Now the good parts. We had an unbelievable 15 boats! 13 made it to the start line and most finished. That despite cold north wind and up to 30 knots sustained 25 knots. This was a true test of the crews and skippers. Very well done, indeed. The 15 paid boats also mean that our yearly race expenses are covered and that the race program didn't cost the rest of the club. (This is not necessary mandatory or a must or even asked for, but it's nice if it happens.)

Next year I would like to see more than one BYC boat on the line please. I know it was cold and blustery but you guys can do this. Just put an extra reef in the sail and you are good. We did have moments of sunshine out there as well!

A couple notes to the race. Rich Pendle on his Beneteau 235 sailed both races SOLO. What an accomplishment Rich, very well done! Rex Carr had his Masthead chute (also called SCHPINNAKER by some) up in 25 knots of wind. His bow was out of the water 1/3 the length of his hull and you could see the pucker factor in the faces of his entire crew! Good showing and very brave!

The Great Race is coming up at the end of the month. This is one lap around the lake with hound and hare start. It's an easy race to participate in. Winning is a different story as all the good boats are usually out there. I hope I see some BYC boats participating in that year end event, which is usually expertly run by CYC and loads of fun. (Especially if the wind is from the east or west and blowing a steady 15 knots ...lol)

Kort will be your Race chair in 011 and I want to ask all of you guys to give him all the same help and positive feedback I have received the last 2 years. I will be on standby and will help Kort in any ways I can. The next months will be the transition time and both of us would really like to hear from you our members what can be done better or different, what you like and what you don't like. Remember that the race program is for all the members and that we like all the members to participate.

The Club championship is decided and will be made official in next month's bits and the bragging flags will be distributed at the No Boat Party in Feb.

In other news, have you had the chance to look around on Marina grounds, flowers at the entrance, all over the place new paint, a paved driveway? Wow... our home away from home looks real nice.
