

The inline check valve between the pump and hot water heater ruptured and directed the pressurized water throughout the engine compartment. Ironically, I'd replaced this same valve last year. Duh!! I really wanted to blame the valve (manufacturer) but visual inspection indicated damage due to freezing. Okay, so it only takes two laps around the lake to figure out this valve will need to be removed and bled at the end of the season. It's always the little things. Did I mention how great it is to be tied to the dock again? We hope to see a few more boats in the water next weekend when we celebrate Cinco de Mayo and the Kentucky Derby. Join in the fun, watch the run for the roses and usher in the month of May.
