Triscuit "Tartlets"

Let stand 2 to 3 minutes or until softened.
Press 1 cracker into each of 6 mini muffin pan cups sprayed with cooking spray.
Repeat to make a total of 24 crusts.
Bake 25 minutes. Cool.
Fill cracker cups with your favorite ingredients.

I made 2 kinds.....one had Cajun crab dip garnished with a baby shrimp and fresh dill sprig. The other was pork sausage and cheese wiz/velvetta garnished with a slice of green pepper and black olive. Thanks for all your votes!
