It seems we clean polish and varnish the exterior, but I have not done very much to the interior. Oh I wipe it down in the spring to get rid of the winter mold causing the finish to get dull and losing its luster and resistance to stains that I spill on it. Is it as hard to refinish as the exterior teak that has sun baking down on it with bird dropping and bug residue? No is not but is has some things you might due different. One thing is a very light sanding not a heavy machine sanding that would go through the very thin veneer. Ventilation could be problem if it's hot and you cabin is closed so I waited for a cool day and chose conventional varnish. I pulled in outside air with my air condition and I still took breaks outside to get away from it, but now my interior wood and bulkheads are bright and almost look new.
