people to RSVP and let our willing, hardworking hosts know they would like to attend the party, we are receiving as few as 10-12 responses by the deadlines. We have very generous people who offer to host a party. They work extremely hard to make it a wonderful time with good food and drinks. However, when they do not receive the RSVP's by the due date, their job becomes very difficult. They are then asked to guess how many people might show up. Or the night before the party, the hosts are rushing to the store to buy more food to prepare for those who have called in late to ask to attend. Here's an example of the magnitude of this problem: by the RSVP date of the last party, we had 12 reservations. By the night before the party, we had 35 reservations. The day of the party, we had 55 people wanting to attend. The hosts were only able to accommodate 49 people. Basically, 25% answered to say they would attend by the proper date. I'm not sure what the answer should be to help alleviate this problem. However, it is a problem. We cannot expect our hosts to go to extremes to accommodate people because they forget to send in their reservations. We all must pay attention to the Party Flyers that are sent with every Boulder Bits. As soon as you receive it, check your schedule, find out if you can attend, and immediately send in your check to make your reservation. Let's not make this any harder than it has to be on our generous members who volunteer to host these parties. If this continues to be a problem, we may have to limit the attendance to those who have reservations and none will be taken at the door. Please do your part. SEND IN YOUR RESERVATIONS ON TIME. It's very important. Your hosts will thank you.
