Radio Etiquette: Proper use of our VHF Radios will make communicating easier and will be appreciated by all.

- 1. Monitor Channel 16 for calls and announcements.
- 2. To make a call, say the name of the vessel that you are calling two or three times and the name of the vessel making the call. E.g.: "Bounty, Bounty, Bounty, this is Bligh, over."
- 3. To answer a call: "Bligh, this is Bounty, over."
- 4. Unless the situation is an emergency, you should then ask that the call be switched to a different channel. "Bounty, switch to Channel 68, over."
- 5. This request must be acknowledged. "Bligh, this is Bounty, switching to 68, over."
- 6. Now carry on your non-emergency conversation on Channel 68. Other noncommercial intership channels are 69, 71 and 72.
- 7. Keep your conversation brief and avoid the use of profanity.
- 8. To end a call, say the word "out". Never 'over and out.'

Unless an agreement has been discussed to remain on a certain channel, the vessels will return to Channel 16 to monitor their radios. It is not necessary to announce that you are returning to Channel 16.

NOTES FROM THE ETHER

It has been a little over a year since we started publishing *Boulder Bits* electronically. At the present time approximately 15 percent of our membership receives their issues of *Boulder Bits* via e-mail.

For those of you not familiar with its availability that way, we create the electronic newsletter using Adobe Acrobat and attach it to an e-mail message (I had been providing the *e-Bits* with only a hyperlink in the e-mail, but for some that has not worked satisfactorily). In addition, the current edition as well as all back issues are

available on our web site.

Benefits of receiving the Bits via e-mail are the ready availability of having a copy residing in your computer for as long as you want, and the savings the club obtains by eliminating the postage and paper associated with the mailing. If you haven't tried it, why not. If you find you don't like it, we can easily restore the tried and true snail mail method.

Should you want to receive the Bits this way, just send an e-mail to boulderyc@yahoo.com and provide your name and e-mail address(es) you would like to have delivery sent.

There have been some technical problems relating to viewing the bits using Microsoft Internet Explorer (IE). For what appears to be security reasons, IE is very particular in viewing PDF files. Should you have a problem in viewing the *e-Bits* through IE, then download the file and view it directly with the Acrobat viewer or use Netscape Navigator, which seems to be immune to these problems.
